About the 2019 Theme:

“Leading the Way Forward: Access, Accountability and Action”

With the IIMHL/IIDL joint focus on leadership, we adopted the theme: *“Leading the Way Forward”*. Each of the words in the theme is meaningful in both the US context as well as in the broader international context. The theme also resonates strongly with international developments in the disability sector around access and social inclusion as well as the increased focus on individualised funding and personalised support. Many Match topics and the current international dialogue fit within at least one of the three sub-themes:

- *Access* is about ensuring availability of high quality supports and services and a focus on people with lived experience of mental health distress and disability
- *Accountability* addresses systems and supports to ensure effectiveness and outcomes for people, families and communities
- *Action* speaks to engaging all partners in all sectors and across the lifespan, in enacting meaningful change in supporting healthy people in healthy and inclusive environments.
