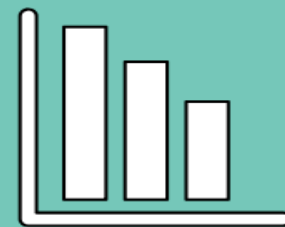
People with Learning Disabilities in Scotland: An overview



Over 21,000 adults and over 5,000 children with a learning disability recorded

Over 23,000 people with learning disabilities are known to local authorities

There could be over 100,000 people with a learning disability in Scotland, not reflected in data sources



The same as you?

In 2000 the Scottish Government published a wide ranging review of learning disabilities supports and services in Scotland. 'The same as you?' outlined a 10-year programme for service development that emphasised:

- Citizenship and a place in the community free from harm or discrimination
- Equality of access to mainstream services
- Personalisation, choice and control in service delivery
- Greater investment in high quality, locally based services and supports
- Partnership working across agencies
